



Curriculum COVID catch up 2022

We have worked hard to ensure our curriculum meets the needs of our pupils and ensures any gaps caused by COVID move to remote learning are filled. Our curriculum is full and remains broad and ambitious with prioritisation within subjects of the most important components for progression.

Our curriculum will constantly be reviewed to ensure all classes and year groups receive what they need – an appropriate balance of well-being and academic learning. Well-being will be taught throughout the week to ensure all pupils are supported – please see additional *Pastoral* document.

Catch up approach

WH is used to catching up pupils gaps in learning as we have a highly mobile intake and pupils' previous experiences vary greatly. This is our practice from Pre-school to Year 6.

We assess formally to ensure we know where pupils' gaps are and what they need prioritising. This will be informed by soft assessments to support teaching by ensuring all gaps are identified and addressed. This information is then used to carefully plan the pupils next steps in their learning journey. Provision maps are clear on what pupils need alongside the National Curriculum content so they do not fall behind. Boosters, pre and post teaching and interventions run alongside quality first teaching.

Catch up Foundation approach

This was successful and no catch up units are now needed. Focus Learning Days are now in place to support enthusiasm and a broad and balanced curriculum for all around days of interest to our school community.
