After a difficult year for all children I cannot stress enough the importance of supporting your child as they grow and would urge you to pay particular attention to the development of their self-esteem. It is crucial to their academic achievement, participation, engagement in activities, social relationships, and, ultimately, their sense of wellbeing.

The following are all factors that can positively influence the growth of a child's self-esteem and encourage them to believe in themselves:

Praising effort, encouraging friendships, helping them to identify and use their strengths, letting them know they're loved and valued, encouraging them to find and try new things and encouraging them to overcome difficulties by thinking calmly. Remind them that asking for help is a sign of strength not weakness and most of all to practice kindness to themselves and to others.

Dear parents and families,

It was great to welcome all the children back to school on 8th March, and I know all the teachers are proud of them as they have, yet again adapted amazingly well to the changes they have had to experience. It has been and continues to be challenging for us all, but hope is on the horizon with the vaccination role out going well in the UK, and with twice weekly testing happening in schools across the country. We previously shared with you that as a family of school aged children, Covid tests are available to you, your household and support bubble. For further information please refer to the letter on our website.

We have had various activities going ahead either in school or virtually where needed. We are continuing to offer a number of <u>virtual clubs</u> which I would like to thank the staff for their time and effort they put into these. I think it makes such a difference to the children's wellbeing to be able to access resources such as these, especially from familiar faces. We have been able to start after school sports clubs with Mr Palmer and Miss Timberlake, which the children are enjoying immensely. We also held parents meeting virtually as we did back in October and was pleased to receive great feedback of what a success it was again.

We enjoyed Red Nose day, where children and teachers dressed in red with lots of fun outfits and a sea of different shades of red. Thank you for your kind donations which will go towards helping tackle important issues including homelessness, hunger, domestic abuse and mental health stigma, all of which have been impacted by the Covid-19 pandemic.

To keep the children moving and reduce the traffic and number of cars outside school during drop off and collection times, we would like to encourage you to take part in The Living Streets' WOW which started on 15th March. As a reminder, it is a year-round walk to school challenge which rewards your child for travelling to school sustainably. I know this is not easy for everyone to do, but please do try your best if at all possible. I have previously shared the great news with you that pathway improvements outside the school are now on the agenda with the Local Council and I will keep you informed about how this is moving forward as and when I hear any updates.

Our FLOs (Family Liaison Officers) have recently had a virtual meeting and are in the process of starting up a community link group so we can work together in harmony as a school with parents and local residents. More information will be shared with you and if you wish to join, please do email the office for the attention of the FLO team.

For those of you know about our school pets, unfortunately we sadly lost Toffee one of our gerbils back in February. Toffee lived a long and healthy life for a gerbil, as they often only survive for approximately 2 years, but he was a ripe old age of 5. He will be sadly missed by the children, myself and his brother, Waffle. Waffle is doing well and has gone on his holidays for Easter.
