The children have loved exploring their new areas and getting to know their new friends in their classes. ### **Year 1 News**

In Maths we have practised finding one more and one less than a number, adding and subtracting, focusing on the use of number lines to support.

In English we have enjoyed reading exciting books such as Dinosaurs in the Supermarket, Cops & Robbers and Peace at Last. Children have practised their reading, focusing on rereading sentences to improve their understanding and answered questions. In writing, children have focused on using adjectives and checking that their punctuation is perfect.

In Science we have been thinking about the human bodies, and how our senses help us to explore the world around us. In Geography we have interpreted and created maps, using them to represent our school. Our Art lessons have focussed on the use of primary colours, secondary colours and using black and white to mix tints and shades.

In Year 1 we celebrated the life of Queen Elizabeth II by thinking about her role and her achievements.

## **Year 2 News**

What an amazing half term we have had! In Maths we have been learning how to use the column method to add and subtract 2-digit numbers. We have also looked at exchanging and regrouping when using the column method. In English, we have read the books Flat Stanley, Meerkat Mail and Lost and Found and learnt lots of new concepts such as using a range a punctuation, noun phrases and expanded noun phrases, co-ordinating and subordinating conjunctions and sentence types. In Art this half term we have been using shape and colour to create unique artworks like those of Henri Matisse. Our Geography lessons have been focused on maps and we have begun using Atlas's. In Science we have been looking at the human body and how to stay healthy. Finally, we have finished off the term with our Harvest Festival Assembly and the trip to Wendover Woods, the whole year 2 team are very proud of what you have all achieved.



#### **Year 4 News**

Year 4 have had a great, and very busy, first half term! The highlight for some classes has been starting swimming lessons and for others it has been learning to play the recorder. All classes have thoroughly enjoyed reading the class book, 'Bill's New Frock', which has resulted in some great discussions, expressive reading and pieces of persuasive writing. The teachers have been impressed by how quickly the children have been learning to add and subtract 4-digit numbers including carrying and exchanging. Can you challenge them to teach you the methods they use? In Science we have carried out investigations to help us learn about the digestive process. The children have shown some dramatic drawing skills using dark and light to create various tones in art lessons. In geography the children have improved their knowledge of map reading skills including how to read map grid references.

Year 5 have had a successful start to the year – we've all been so impressed with the way everyone has settled back in and how hard everyone has been working!



During our Maths lessons, the children have secured their knowledge of place value and have been working hard to develop their written and mental addition and subtraction strategies.

Throughout the half term, the children have been working on their Maths skills, looking at the four operations, fractions, and place value. In English, the children have started their first SQUIRT text of the year, The Clockwork Sparrow, and the children have thoroughly enjoyed the start of the book. In our afternoon sessions, the children have been learning about the earth and its geography, focusing on time zones and lines of latitude and longitude. In PE, the children have been creating their own gymnastics routines in indoor PE and practicing their tennis skills in outdoor PE. Last week, the children completed their first assessment week of the year and all the staff were incredibly impressed with their focus and hard work during the week. This week, we have got a total of 80 children joining us at River Dart for an exciting week full of team building activities and the children have had a great time! The children in school have spent the week completing investigations, baking, topic afternoons and craft and drama activities.
