In Maths, we revised our multiplication and division facts up to 12 and have looked at the perimeter of rectilinear shapes including drawing our own.

In History, we went back in time to explore the power struggle between Vikings and Anglo-Saxons including a humorous story about Alfred the Great burning some cakes. In DT, we designed, created and evaluated our own greeting cards with a sneaky surprise inside.

Year 5 News

Year 5 have had another successful half term and have enjoyed developing their knowledge across the curriculum.

A highlight of the half term has been our Science lessons. We have had great fun engaging in lots of different investigations to understand changing materials; we've blown balloons up with vinegar and bicarbonate of soda; separated mixtures using different methods and; set paper alight!



In addition, the children have relished the challenge of creating their own cam mechanisms and have use these to make products with actual moving parts.

Furthermore, they have been extremely interested with the life of Alexander the Great and have had some excellent debates about his leadership skills.

Finally, Year 5 have thoroughly enjoyed reading 'Who Let the Gods Out' during their SQUIRT sessions and have written some fantastic narratives, newspaper reports and persuasive texts inspired by the events of the story.

As always, Year 6 have been extremely busy this half term. We have been reading The Clockwork Sparrow by Katherine Woodfine and have really enjoyed using it as inspiration to write our own stories.

In Maths, we have focused a lot on using fractions, decimals and percentages and on using facts which we already know to help us answer questions.

Even though we haven't been able to get together as a whole year group this year, Year 6 have really enjoyed learning to sing the Shakin' Stevens' Christmas classic Merry Christmas Everyone. Each class practiced separately in the hall and we had a fantastic time singing together. When we were ready, we recorded the three classes singing separately and then we have mixed the recordings into one so that we can all sing together to wish you a very Merry Christmas!
