Counsellor

Overview: To provide pastoral care to children and their families.

Aim/Outcome:

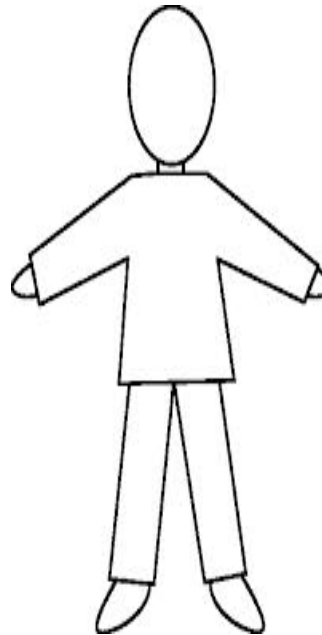
- Children will be able to self-regulate.
- Increased confidence and self-esteem in children
- Build up positive relationships with 'hard to reach' families and school
- Children are happier and therefore access learning
- Children are less anxious

Attendance support - FLO

Overview: Attendance team work together to promote attendance and punctuality across the whole school

Aim/Outcome:

- To improve attendance of PP children
- To close the attendance gap from PP and 'All other' children
- To ensure that all pupils are in school and leaning
- To reduce lates



Pupil support - FLO

Overview: To provide a safe environment where children can learn how to self-regulate and socialise

Aim/Outcome:

- Increased confidence and self-esteem
- To improve behaviour
- To raise aspirations, motivation and engagement
- Children have bespoke support, including external support
- Children are happier and therefore access learning

Parental support - FLO

Overview: To increase home support, leading to greater parental engagement

Aim/Outcome:

- PAFT support given – children will be ready to learn
- To increase the % of PP parents attending parent consultations
- To offer programmes to support parents e.g. 'Helping Hands.'
- Parents signposted to external agencies where needed

Pupil support – Peer Mentors

Overview: To enable pupils to have the skills to support each other to provide a safe environment

Aim/Outcome:

- Increased confidence and self-esteem
- To improve behaviour
- To raise aspirations, motivation and engagement
